Health offices: The month of September recorded a total of 892 visits to the health offices. This included illness, injuries, medication administration and health conditions. Please be sure to have current emergency contact information in the Parent Portal.

When to Keep Your Child Home: One of the goals of health services is to assure a healthy environment. Many parents ask about when students should stay home or attend school. The following information is intended to help guide you with making that decision.

- If a student has a fever of 100 degrees or more, the student should stay at home until 24 hours after the temperature has returned to normal (without the use of a fever-reducing medication.)
- If a student has diarrhea or has vomited, the student should stay home until symptom free for 24 hours.
- If a student has a rash that may be related to disease, or the cause is unknown, please see a doctor before sending the student to school.

Hearing and Vision: With the help of some excellent volunteers, we screened grades 1, 3, and 5 for hearing and vision. Rescreens were completed and referral letters have been sent home. Remember that you may refer a student to me any time during the school year for a hearing or vision screening.

Feel free to contact Tiffany Boraas, Licensed School Nurse at any of the health offices with questions or concerns.

STUDENT FLU CLINIC

Zumbrota-Mazeppa Schools will be partnering with Minnesota Visiting Nurses Agency (MVNA) to provide flu vaccinations to ZM students during school.

The Flumist (nasal vaccine) will NOT be available this year as it was found to be ineffective. Experienced nurses will help children who are anxious about shots.



We will be holding a flu clinic at each school:

- The Zumbrota flu clinic (K-2 and 7-12) will be on Thursday, November 10th in the auditorium from 8:15 am -11:15am.
- The Mazeppa flu clinic (3-6) will be on Friday, November 11th from 8:30 am -10:30 am.

Goodhue County Health & Human Services will offer a flu vaccination clinic for children and adults on November 10. The Quadrivalent Flu Injection will be offered for children 6 months and older. FluMist nasal vaccine **WILL NOT** be offered due to new CDC recommendations.

Bring a copy of your insurance card. A MnSure representative will be available at the clinic to help individuals apply for health insurance through the MnSure program. If you choose to pay privately, cost is \$35. Children and adults without insurance may qualify to receive flu vaccinations for \$20 or less.

The regular monthly school board meeting was held Monday, October 24, 2016 in the middle/high school media center in Zumbrota. Business was conducted as usual, including payment of bills.

Recognition: Mr. Anger recognized the Mazeppa Senior Citizens for their \$250 donation for school supplies. The FFA was also recognized.

Reports:

Kim Hillberg from CliftonLarsonAllen reported on the 2015-16 school audit. She presented a PowerPoint slide presentation in addition to going over the financial statements. The audit was reported as a clean audit.

Brian Wright from Lunchtime Solutions reported on the food service program. He reported that meal counts were running steady with breakfast up a little and lunch down a little.

Mr. Anderson reported for the middle/high school. The curricu- The following personnel items were acted on: lum committee met and discussed new course proposals. The registration timeline for the 2017-18 school year has been shared with teachers with a December 21 deadline for class changes. Attendance at teacher conferences was low in October.
