SCHOOL BOARD MINUTES

The school board held their monthly work session following the organization meeting January 6. Items discussed included:

- Elementary Addition due to the 1.3-million-dollar cost to do a lower level at the elementary site, it was recommended that the board stick with the original renovation plan.
- District Security Procedure for Building Designers to Consider - There will be one secure entrance at the primary so preschool parents and students will need to enter through that door for security purposes. There will be ongoing discussion on the preschool and kindergarten room placement. Language for a district policy was also discussed. The sample language included: "All visitors must report through the main office of each building. A "Background Check System" will be implemented at the beginning of the 2021 school year. From the start of the 2021 school year and beyond, any visitor who wants access to any part of the school will have to swipe his or her driver's license. Once a driver's license has been put in the system, the license will be in the system. The data from the license will only indicate known sex offenders, protection orders, and custody agreements. When a visitor has been cleared, a badge will be printed, and the visitor will be admitted into the building.
- 3. Safety Grant ZM had previously received a state safety grant for the early childhood building. Since that building will not be used after the renovations take place, the grant cannot be used for the original purpose. However, \$15,000 in technology equipment will be able to be moved to the new location when the early childhood moves.

4. Zumbrota Boiler - New boilers were installed in 2008 with ten-year warranties. One boiler broke and was covered under warranty. The other boiler broke after the warranty ran out and was replaced. However, the first one covered under warranty has now cracked again and will cost \$40-\$50,000 to fix. Steve Pahl and Mr. Harvey are working with the boiler company to see what recourse the school has and if the boiler company will stand behind the three-year-old broken boiler heat exchanger.

Mr. Harvey informed the board that Brian Wright from Lunchtime Solutions will be leaving as food service director at the end of January. He will be missed at ZM and was thanked for his service.

A special meeting was held January 13 following the bond sale earlier in the day. Jeff Seeley from Ehlers was present to review the 2020A bond sale that took place earlier in the day. He reviewed the sale day report that showed a considerable saving to the taxpayers through the school's upgraded bond rating. A plaque was presented to the board noting this upgrade. The board approved the resolution relating to \$30,840,000 general obligation school building and facilities maintenance bonds, series 2020A; authorizing the issuance, awarding the sale, prescribing the form and details and providing for the payment thereof. Mr. Dave Thompson presented "The Third Teacher" book study with the board. The meeting adjourned at 8:40 pm.

The regular monthly meeting was held January 27 in the elementary media center in Mazeppa. The usual business was conducted, including payment of bills.

SCHOOL BOARD MEETING MINUTES

The ZM held their organization meeting January 6 in the elementary media center. Stephanie Miller, who was elected this past November, was administered the school board oath of office by Chair Roth. Order of Business: Chair Roth was nominated for chair and upon the motion to cease nominations, was unanimously elected. Jason Lohmann was nominated for vice-chair and unanimously elected, along with Angie Bredehoft as clerk and James Wendt as treasurer.

The regular school board meeting dates were set for the fourth Monday of each month at 7:00 pm with the sites alternating between Mazeppa and Zumbrota. The May and December board meetings will be moved up one week to avoid holiday conflicts and the July work session is cancelled. Any regular meetings that cannot be held at the scheduled time due to inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be held the next day at the same time, thereby eliminating the three-day notice required for meetings.

The official district bulletin boards were designated at the Superintendent's Office, ZMHS Main Door on Mill Street, and ZMPR Main Door on Mill Street. The Bank of Zumbrota was named the general depository and investment sites include the First State Bank of Red Wing at Mazeppa, Bank of Zumbrota, Liquid Assets, Edward Jones at Zumbrota, and Ehler's.

Electronic transfer authorization was given to Diane Matthees, Carol Glander, and School Management Systems in 2020. Authorization for stop payment and revoked documents was given to Diane Matthees and School Management Systems. The superintendent, chair, and treasurer were given authorization to invest surplus funds and the superintendent and treasurer were granted access to the safe deposit box #503 at the downtown Bank of Zumbrota. The legal firms of Rockne Law Office, Zumbrota; Ratwik Roszak, & Mahoney, P.A.; and Dunlap & Seeger, P.A. were designated the school attorneys. The News Record was designated the official school newspaper. The superintendent was named as the Identified Official with Authority to authorize user access to the Minnesota Department of Education's secure websites for ZM. The superintendent was also given authority to enter into contracts and approve payments on behalf of the district. The Mayo Clinic Health Systems—Zumbrota Clinic and the Goodhue/ Wabasha Health Services were named the general school clinics.

Board director compensation for 2020 was set at \$2,500 with \$15 per hour for board members required to attend meetings on legal issues and negotiations during the workday. The board chair per diem was set at \$300 per year. There were no other director per diems. Board negotiators will be paid \$30 per session. The 2020 federal mileage rate will apply for travel and the meals/lodging allowance for attending workshops and conferences was set at \$12 for breakfast, \$15 for lunch, and \$22 for dinner.

We are still seeing influenza like illnesses! It is not too late to get your flu vaccine

Message from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC): The end of 2019 brought us an atypical start to the influenza season. We had an early start to the influenza season and Influenza B/Victoria viruses are predominant, which is unusual for this time of year. This early start does not mean that the influenza season will end early. It is likely that flu activity will remain elevated through late January. It is possible we will have another peak in Influenza activity again in January or February. It is not too late to

get vaccinated. Flu vaccination is always the best way to prevent flu and its potentially seri-

ous complications. Influenza is spread by coughing or sneezing, and by touching contaminated hands, objects, or surfaces. Symptoms may last up to 7 days and people with influenza are contagious for 24 hours before symptoms present and up to 7 days after illness begins. Please stay home if/when you have symptoms.

Be sure to let the school office staff know if your student is home with an influenza-like-illness (ILI). ILI is defined as a fever of 100.0 degrees F or higher, and cough or sore throat (in absence of a known disease other than influenza). It is important for parents to report symptoms keeping students' home as we are tracking symptoms for state health monitoring.

Guidelines for returning to school: A student should not come to school if they have had a fever of 100 degrees F or more in the past 24 hours (students must be fever free for 24 hours WITHOUT the use of fever reducing medication): vomiting or diarrhea in the past 24 hours: tested positive for strep (must stay home until 24 hours after antibiotic treatment started): an undiagnosed skin rash. Please help us keep all our students healthy by following these recommendations.


One Act Play Rescheduled

ZM's Drama Department presents the one-act play "Totally Red". This play was rescheduled after a snowstorm and will not be held February 4.




