SCHOOL BOARD MEETING MINUTES

School Board Work Session—Monday, May 11, 2020

Items for Discussion:

- 1. 2020-21 Budget: School Management Systems representatives, Todd Noetzke and Nicole Fitzgerald, reviewed the budget summary. There are many variables to consider yet such as the number of students enrolling or not coming back in the next school year and if the 2% formula will be used. The budget will be on the May 18 meeting for approval.
- 2. Covid Updates: Mr. Harvey said the state has not given directives on food service or childcare as of the meeting date. He also noted that the state advised schools to be forgiving regarding grading, etc. Graduation was discussed; the state will allow a drive up graduation ceremony and that is what ZM is planning. Board participation will be limited in order to follow the social distancing guidelines. The community ed childcare fees will be an action item at the May 18 meeting.
- 3. Building Project Updates: Construction has begun at the primary and cougar care site. Mr. Harvey noted that the primary site front door may be inaccessible in the fall and buses will unload and pickup in the back of the school. The new cougar care additions should be completed by January and the primary additions by next spring. Work on the elementary, middle, and high school will be next summer.
- 4. Proposed Q-Comp Changes: A draft of the changes was available for board review. The plan will be on the May 18 agenda for approval. A memorandum of understanding may be needed for the rest of this school year.

- 6. Updated Budget for 2019-20: Budget updates were reviewed and will be on the May 18 agenda for approval.

Regular Board Meeting—Monday, May 18, 2020

The regular monthly meeting was held via Zoom at 7:00 pm. Reports: Mr. Anderson reported for the middle/high school. He informed the board on the graduation guidelines during Covid 19. The ACT tests have been rescheduled to October 6 for the 2021 students and March 30 for the 2022 students. Device pick up day is May 27 from 8:00 am - 6:00 pm. Academic courses for grades 7-12 conclude May 22. Students have the week of May 26-29 to make up any missing work.

Mr. Rasmussen reported for the primary/elementary school. Device drop off and material pick up day is May 26 with two shifts - one from 11:00 a. -12:30 pm and another from 4:30 - 6:30 pm. Each classroom teacher has set up a zoom meeting for individual sessions before year end.

Ms. Ahern reported for special education and primary. Kindergarten registration forms have been mailed and staff is working on kindergarten round-up. Extended school year is being planned, but waiting and following Department of Education guidelines. She also thanked local organizations and individuals for donations to the meal program.

Mr. Harvey reported enrollment at 1,318, holding steady throughout most of the year. There was no patron input.

Old Business: Quotes for the 2020-21 constructional house were opened May 15 for excavating, footings and flatwork, plumbing, HVAC, and lumber and approved as follows:

- excavating quote from Schumacher Excavating for \$15,800.
- footings, poured walls, flatwork quote from Creative Concrete for \$45,112.50.
- plumbing quote from Route 60 for \$13,100.00.
- HVAC quote from Route 60 for \$21,650.00. Mr. Lohmann requested that in-floor tubing be added for heating.
- lumber quote from Arrow Building Center for \$71,305.71.

The 2020-21 budget was approved as follows: General Fund

Mr. Harvey reviewed the graduation guidelines that the state has mandated with the board. This guidance mandates to school districts that the ceremony can not be held outside in stadiums or on football fields where face to face contact could occur. Failure to follow the guidance as a district and attendee exposes the district and attendee to personal and criminal liability.

During this ceremony:

- Attendees should not get out of their vehicle.
- Speakers will be allowed to leave their vehicle for their speech.
- Vehicles will be assigned to every other stall to allow for



- Vehicles closer than six feet should have their windows up.
- This is an invite only event and attendees are expected to follow the guidelines outlined in order to remain at the event.
- Deviation from these guidelines by attendees will result in the ceremony being cancelled immediately.

Mr. Harvey gave building project updates, including what has been started, timelines, etc. He also gave a Covid 19 update on summer childcare, meals, etc. Community Ed is not sure whether or not summer programs will be held; more information will follow on this. There will be no year-end breakfast program for retirees; another means of recognition will be held.

The 2020-21 dental insurance renewal rates from Health Partners were approved as presented.

The board motioned to call for furniture and equipment bids for the Cougar Care and Primary building project. The Q Comp agreement was approved as presented. The Minnesota State High School League resolution for the 2020-21 school year was approved.

The Cougar Care proposal and fees for summer childcare was approved as presented by the community education director.

Board Comments and Reports: Mr. Lohmann thanked the ZM staff, students, and parents for their extra efforts during the distance learning time and this was also expressed by Board Chair Roth. There were no minutes from the Wasioja Education Technology Cooperative. Minutes were available from the Goodhue County Education District and the Southeast Service Cooperative.
