ZM Schools has a school board and a bond referendum election scheduled for November 5. On the ballot for school board is Stephanie Miller, who was appointed last fall to fill a vacancy on the board. As per state law, schools are required to run an election the following year to fill the appointed

position. Also on the ballot are three questions for the renovation and expansion of existing facilities at ZM. After hearing from over 800 district residents, a majority of which indicated they would like a new plan put to vote, the district has proposed three questions. Below is the Notice of Special Election:

School District Question 1 Approval of School Building Bonds

Shall the board of Independent School District No. 2805 (Zumbrota-Mazeppa), Minnesota, be authorized to issue general obligation school building bonds in an amount not to exceed \$38,585,000 for acquisition and betterment of school sites and facilities, including but not limited to, safety/security and heating/ventilation improvements, technical/trades education learning space expansion, auditorium upgrades, classroom additions and renovations, Zumbrota cafeteria expansion and Mazeppa kitchen and cafeteria code compliance upgrades and expansion?


Although the type of learning looks different for different age groups, Online Learning remains a good option for a majority of our students when traditional face to face learning cannot take place.

SCHOOL BOARD MEETING MINUTES

The school board held their monthly work session on October 14. Items discussed included the following:

2018-19 School Audit. CliftonLarsonAllen representative, Craig Popenhagen, reviewed the 2018-19 school audit. He informed the board that the audit was considered a very clean audit and they found no financial issues. He reviewed the financial statements and graphs with the board. The audit was approved as presented. Kennedy Transportation SPED Contract

Mr. Harvey reviewed the cost of running the special education routes during the school year. It costs \$3,795 per vehicle for nine months. Other costs include \$1.25 per mile for extra-curricular trips, \$18.25 per hour from time of departure to return per trip, and \$20 per trip in the city limits. The contract will be on the October 28 board agenda for possible approval.

Girls Track Uniforms

Jared Andring, track coach, was in attendance to request that the board move up the girls uniform purchase as he does not have enough uniforms for the track members. This will be on the board agenda October 28.

Mr. Harvey reviewed with the board what maintenance of effort was and answered questions from the board.

Mr. Harvey gave the board the new flyer that will be mailed this week to all district households. He noted that the information that has been sent has been favorably viewed by residents. Lane changes for the following were presented to the board for

The board held a Review and Comment meeting at 6:00 pm on October 28 to review the Commissioner's statement on the proposed building bonds. The Commissioner's statement was as follows: "Based on the department's analysis of the school district's required documentation and other pertinent information from sources of the Minnesota Department of Education, the Commissioner of Education provides a positive review and comment."

Mr. Harvey reviewed the scope of the project and reviewed information from the public survey. An opportunity for the audience to

ask questions and comment was held.

The regular board meeting followed the Review and Comment special meeting. Mr. Anderson reported for the middle/high school, Mr. Rasmussen for the primary/elementary school, and Ms. Ahern on special education. Mr. Harvey reviewed the building project and the treasurer's report was available for review.

Old Business: The 2019-20 teacher and probationary teacher and non-certified seniority lists were approved as presented. The Kennedy Transportation special ed contract was approved as well as the purchase of girls track uniforms. 

Health Offices: The month of September recorded a total of 850+ visits to the health offices. This included illness, injuries, medication administration and health conditions. Please be sure to have current emergency contact information in the Parent Portal. **When to Keep Your Child Home:**

One of the goals of health services is to assure a healthy environment. Many parents ask about when students should stay home or attend school. The following information is intended to help guide you with making that decision.

* If a student has a fever of 100 degrees or more, the student should stay at home until 24 hours after the temperature has returned to normal (without the use of a fever-

reducing medication.)

- * If a student has diarrhea or has vomited, the student should stay home until symptom free for 24 hours.
- * If a student has a rash that may be related to disease, or the cause is unknown, please see a doctor before sending the student to school. Please report the symptoms your child has to the office when you are calling or emailing to let us know they are staying home ill so that we can use this information for health tracking.

Hearing and Vision: With the help of some excellent volunteers, we screened grades 1, 3, 5, and 7 for hearing and vision. Rescreens were completed and referral letters have been sent home. Remember that you may refer a student at any time during the school year for a hearing or vision screening.

Scoliosis screening: Studies estimate that two to five of every 100 children develop scoliosis (abnormal curve in the back), and some require treatment. Early detection and treatment help prevent or minimize the development of severe spinal problems. We will be screening all 5th grade girls in the beginning of November and plan to screen 6th grade girls in the spring of 2020. INFLUENZA SEASON IS UPON US:

Influenza is a contagious respiratory infection that spreads around the United States every year, usually between October and May. Symptoms can vary by age, but can include: fever/chills, sore throat, cough, muscle aches, headache, fatigue, runny or stuffy nose. Flu can also lead to pneumonia and worsen other medical conditions. Protect yourself and others by getting your influenza vaccine.
