company model to a local District ran model and an expansion of our Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs. Having our own food service again is a huge undertaking and will take some time to get it to where the District's vision is: Having local control and providing more locally sourced foods with quality and affordability for students and families. Regarded Career and Technical Education, we have added staff for more student course choices in this area. Using our new Career and Technical Education space, we are adding some high technology programming and manufacturing equipment to the district. Prior to the renovations we did not have space for such programs and we are now grateful to be able to build this program area.

When the doors open this Fall, we have over 30 new staff members in the district. Programs that were previously contracted out and retirees make up the bulk of these new staff members. We welcome all of our new staff to the Zumbrota-Mazeppa Community!

Important thing to remember

- Have your child to their bust stop 5 minutes prior to pick up time.
- Please have your child dressed appropriately for weather
- Go over the bus rules with your child
- Riding the bus is a privilege. Students will receive bus violation tickets when the rules are not followed.
- 1. 1st Violation-Written Warning Report. A report will be send home with the student stating there was misconduct. A parent will need to sign.
- 2. 2nd Violation-Written Report. A report will be sent home with the student stating there was misconduct. A parent will need to sign. Loses bus riding privilege for 1 day.
- 3. 3rd Violation-Written Report and Conference. A report will be sent home with the student stating there was misconduct. A parent will need to sign. Student will lose bus riding privileges for 2-5 days, depending on the severity of the incident. A conference will be held with principal, bus contractor and parents
- 4. 4th Violation-Written Report and Conference-A report will be sent home stating the student has now lost their bus riding privilege for the remainder of the school year. A conference will be held with the principal, bus contractor and parents.

Please note that route and shuttle buses are at full capacity. Palmer Bus Service of Zumbrota-Mazeppa request no extra student riders for birthday parties, sleepovers, etc. The only extra riders allowed will be emergency situations or a daycare issue.

ANNUAL PARENT NOTIFICATIONS

Minnesota Statute requires we provide annual notification to parents, staff, and students of Zumbrota-Mazeppa Public Schools of the topics below. If you have any questions, please use the contact number found in the notices.

LEAD-IN-WATER ANNUAL NOTIFICATION

Minnesota Statute 121A.335 requires public school buildings serving kindergarten through grade 12 to test for lead in water every 5 years. This statute also requires school districts to make the results of the testing available to the public for review and to notify parents of the availability of the information. Notification may be accomplished by publishing a statement in the "Back to School" newsletter or publication that is available to staff, student, parents and the public.

Zumbrota-Mazeppa Public Schools is committed to providing a safe working and learning environment for employees and students. The district has developed a lead in water management plan and testing program that complies with Minnesota Statute 121A.335, as well as recommendations from the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA's) Lead Contamination Control Act (LCCA) of 1988 and the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH), and Minnesota Department of Education (MDE).

INDOOR AIR QUALITY

Zumbrota-Mazeppa Public Schools has an indoor air quality management plan that outlines specific policies and procedures used in district to address indoor air quality issues. AHERA ANNUAL ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION

PESTICIDE NOTICE

All MN schools are required to inform parents/guardians and school employees that they may request to be notified prior to pesticide application on school property. Pesticides include chemicals which are used to control insects, weeds, rodents or other pests as defined by the law (M.S.123b.575, Subd.9). To be notified about pesticide applications or any other questions regarding the District's pest management practices please contact the District at 507-732-1400.

NOTICE OF NONDISCRIMINATION

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 prohibits discrimination against persons with disabilities in any program receiving federal financial assistance. Notes from the school nurse......

Summer is winding down and it is time to start thinking about what paperwork needs to be turned in before students return to school in August/September.

Medications:

The health office requires new orders each school year for all medications. If your student requires daily mediation or as needed medications for the 2022-23 school year please have your primary provider update medication orders and have them sent to the school.

All medications must be dropped off by an adult and may not be sent to school with student in backpack for the safety of our students. **7th grade parents and new students you may bring medications to the open house on 8/31/22 from 4-6 pm.**

We want to ensure that all students at ZM are healthy, safe and ready to learn. If you have a student with an ongoing health condition (Asthma, Allergies, Diabetes, Seizures, etc.) please contact the health office so that we can have an up-to-date plan for the 2022-2023 school year.

Required Immunizations for 12th graders, 7th graders and Kindergarten students:

Does your child have all the required immunizations for school???

Now is the time to turn in your child's immunization sheets! It is important that your child's paperwork is turned in to the health office prior to the start of the new school year. Students **WILL NOT** be able to start school in the September unless immunization are up to date and on record with the school by the first day of school. Immunizations are required by Minnesota law and must be completed before students can start school in the fall. Kindergarten, 7th grade and 12th grade students have several requirements. All students in grades 7-12 need to show proof of a Tetanus Diphtheria booster shot and meningococcal vaccine after the age of 11 and meningococcal booster after age 16.
