Health offices: The ZM health offices have been very busy

seeing <u>students</u> for illness, injuries, medication administration and health conditions. Please make sure to have current emergency contact information in the Parent Portal so that nursing staff can get ahold of parents/guardians when needed.

When to Keep Your Child Home:

One of the goals of health services is to assure a healthy environment. Many parents ask about when students should stay home or attend school.

- We ask that you keep your student's home if they have the following symptoms:
 - If a student has a **fever** of 100 degrees or more, the student should stay home until 24 hrs AFTER the temperature has returned to normal (without the use of a fever reducing medication.)
 - If a student has **diarrhea** or has **vomited**, the student should stay home until symptom free for 24 hrs.
 - If a student has a **rash** that may be related to a disease, or the cause is unknown, please see a doctor before sending the student to school.
 - If you are keeping your child home because of an illness, please call the school to report specific symptoms and/or diagnosis.
 - If your child tested positive for strep, your child should stay home until 24hrs after the antibiotic treatment has started.
 - COVID symptoms: If your child has a fever 100 degrees or higher; new onset cough or a cough that gets worse; has difficulty/hard time breathing; new loss of taste or smell, please keep your child home and notify the school nurse.

Please report all symptoms your child has to the office when you are calling or emailing to let us know they are staying home ill so that we can use this information for health tracking.

Influenza season is now upon us:

Influenza is a contagious respiratory infection that spreads around the United States every year, usually between October and May. Symptoms can vary by age, but can include: fever/chills, sore throat, cough, muscle aches, headache, fatigue, runny or stuffy nose. Flu can also lead to pneumonia and worsen other medical conditions. Protect yourself and others by getting your influenza vaccine.

Please report the following symptoms to the office to help us monitor influenza-like-illness: Fever of 100 degrees or higher with a sore throat and/or cough. Students may also have fatigue, headache and body aches.

Our Zumbrota/Mazeppa influenza clinic will be held Thursday, November 10th. We will be hosting both student/staff and community clinics that day. See the ZM school website for more information. Immunizations are available at local pharmacies and through your primary care provider.

<u>No Cost At Home COVID-19 Saliva Testing for all</u> Minnesotans:

Every home in Minnesota is eligible to order up to 12 rapid at-home COVID-19 tests for free, while supplies last.

The tests available for order:

Are rapid antigen at-home tests, not PCR

Can be taken anywhere

Give results within 15 minutes (no lab drop-off required) Work whether or not you have COVID-219 symptoms

Work whether or not you are up to date on your COVID-219 vaccines

Are also referred to as self-tests or over-the-counter (OTC) tests

We want to remind parents that we will be implementing Weather Impacted Learning Days (WILD) days again this year. In the event that weather keeps us from having school, the first day will not be a WILD day. Please have your child check Schoology for assignments on WILD days or in the case of younger students have them complete the predetermined activities.

Although the type of learning looks different for different age groups, Online Learning remains a good option for a majority of our students when traditional face to face learning cannot take place.

Parent Choice: Often times predicting weather and road conditions is not a one size fits all decision. Parent opinions on the topic vary from: we should never shut down to, call it off at the first flake of snow. The district weighs a lot of circumstances when making the decision. As a parent, you also weigh in on decisions when weather becomes questionable. If you have a young driver, have them ride the bus and if you ever question the safety of travel in your area of the school district, you as a parent can decide to keep your child home. Our district covers several municipalities and many townships. If the majority of these roads are plowed and a few are not, we may hold school.
