



# ZM MESSENGER

## Notes from the School Nurse......

**Medications:** ALL medications taken at school should be administered through the health office. Please notify the nurse if your child in KG-12th grade needs a medication at school.

**Scoliosis Screenings:** Zumbrota- Mazeppa schools has brought back the scoliosis screening program in order to identify female students who might have an abnormal curve of the spine (scoliosis). Studies estimate that two to five of every 100 children develop scoliosis, and some require treatment.

Early detection and treatment help prevent or minimize the development of severe spinal problems. This spring we will be completing screenings on 6<sup>th</sup> grade girls. If you are concerned that a student has an abnormal curve and you would like them assessed, please let the nurses know you would like your child screened at any time during the school year.

**Immunizations:** Immunizations the school has on record are viewable in Parent Portal in Infinite Campus. Letters were sent home with 6th and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students reminding them of immunizations are needed before 7<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade. Incoming Kindergarten students will have letters sent home soon.

## **Incoming Kindergarten student requirements:**

DTP – 5th dose Polio – 4th dose MMR – 2nd dose Varicella- 2 doses

Hep B – 3 doses

## **Incoming 7th grader requirements:**

MME and Varicella – 2 doses Tdap booster Meningococcal

## **Incoming 12<sup>th</sup> grader requirements:**

Meningococcal booster

If you choose to file exemptions for any immunizations, forms are available on ZM school website under Parents/Health services/Immunizations, or you can contact the school nurse at 507-732-7848. Students will not be eligible to attend the first day of school in 2022 until we have up to date immunizations on file.

The ZM School Board met on February 27, 2023 for their regular monthly meeting.

Member's Present: Angie Bredehoft, Jason Lohmann, Jean Roth, Stephanie Miller, Travis Liffrig and Jake Rude.

Also Present: Mr. Harvey, Mr. Rasmussen, Ms. Constantine, Ms. Ahern, Mr. Stapleton and Board Clerk Secretary Amber Rasmussen.

Angie Bredehoft called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

There was no recognition.

Consider changes to the Agenda: Mr. Harvey is adding a leave of absence request regarding Roxanne Webster. Jason Lohmann motioned to accept the changes to the agenda. Stephanie Miller seconded the motion. All in favor.

Jason Lohmann motioned to adopt the agenda as presented. Jake Rude seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried.

#### Reports:

Ms. Constantine highlighted that the counselors are working on registration for 6th - 11th grade students. She thanked them for their hard work in this process. She gave an update on the School Transformation update: the team traveled to Stewartville HS on February 1st to observe their REACH program. Afterwards the team met at the Zumbrota Library to discuss their findings and discuss goals for ZM graduates and what programs would be right for teachers and staff at ZM. February 6 all teachers, paras and some board members heard from a BARR and AV-ID program representative with mixed reviews. Two surveys were given, one to the Core Team and one to all MSHS Staff and revealed the same result: 90% of those surveyed felt that ZMHS learners could greatly benefit from the REACH program. Over 85% of those surveyed want to pursue some level of a career pathway model.

Ms. Constantine gave a presentation about a REACH Program (Relationships, Education, Accountability, Character, Hard Work) and why it would be beneficial to ZM Students. Senior Ansley Travo helped with the presentation. Reach would be an elective semester class. It would consist of one block for 7-8 grade, 9-10 grade and 10-11 grade. Structured Study Hall would be dropped and incorporated into REACH. Credit recovery will continue. REACH would be budget neutral. This will be put on

the March 13th work session agenda as an action item in order to give staff time to implement this program for the 23-24 school year.

Mr. Rasmussen highlighted the first band concert of the year was held on February 9. The 8th Grade band and HS Choir came to perform for the Elementary students. 5th Grade will go to Eagle Bluff March 8-10. Staff are starting to plan for MCA Testing. PLC Meeting held on February 8th went well and is valuable for teachers as they discuss student needs and the best way to meet those needs.

Ms Ahern reports targeted services started at the end of January, currently there are 21 1st and 2nd grade students attending. ADSIS application is done, thank you to Mr. Schumacher for helping. Kids Heart Challenge raised \$16,335.00 as of Friday February 24th. Ms. Nelson's 2nd grade will be coming to the March 13th work session to give a presentation on their 3D printer. Adaptive Bowling is starting this week, the students travel to Red Wing for this. The census is showing 82 Kindergarten students for the 23-24 school year. Ms. Ahern mentioned this number usually changes for enrollment.

Mr. Harvey reports enrollment remains steady throughout the school year.

There was no patron input.
