

SOME THINGS TO KNOW

www.zmschools.us: The school website, along with Facebook and Twitter, will keep you up to date and in the know about daily school happenings. Through the website portal parents can pay fees, deposit money in their child's account, or register for Community Ed classes. Check www.zmschools.us often!

Infinite Campus: Parents are strongly urged to sign up for the Infinite Campus Parent Portal where lunch accounts, report cards, and other vital information is available. The permission form is available on the school website under the Parents tab along the top ribbon. Fill out the permission form and return it to a school office. For security sign-up purposes, parents must bring their photo ID when they return their forms. If you have previously set up your portal rights, it is not necessary to do so again.

Messenger: The Messenger component of Infinite Campus will be the provider for instant alert messaging during the school year. As long as you have a current phone number in Infinite Campus, you will receive emergency alerts from the school. Your child's school office secretary can answer any questions you may have regarding these emergency alerts.

Meal Payments: Meal payments can be made online through the Infinite Campus Parent Portal. This real-time service enables parents to see their child's meal account balances and activity on a daily basis. Questions should be addressed to Ashley Lake, Food Service Director. Attendance Policy: Please notify your child's school office before 8:00 am if you child will be absent. You may also email the office secretary. Students who wish to be excused during the day must present a written notice or parents must call prior to 8:00 am on the day they are to be excused. News from the School Nurse: September 2023

The school year is off to a great start! We are so happy to be back together!

Please help us to keep your kids safe while at school:

If your child needs to take ANY medications (self-carry or to be administered by a nurse) or has a health need that would require an

emergency health plan at school please make sure to get the correct paperwork filled out and returned to the health office as soon as possible. Forms are located on health services page of the ZM website. www.zmschools.us Location: Parents tab, Health Services - choose either Health Conditions or Medication.

Cold and flu season is just around the corner!

Contact the office and report illness symptoms and ask to talk with the nurse about necessary next steps.

When to keep your child home:

 \cdot If a student has a fever of 100 degrees or more, the student should stay home until 24 hrs AF-TER the temperature has returned to normal (without the use of a fever reducing medication.)

 \cdot If a student has diarrhea or has vomited, the student should stay home until symptom free for 24 hrs.

 \cdot If a student has a rash that may be related to a disease, or the cause is unknown, please see a doctor before sending the student to school.

 \cdot If your child tested positive for strep, your child should stay home until 24hrs after the antibiotic treatment has started.

Our school district will continue CDC guidance for isolation. If your child tests positive for COVID please keep your child home and notify the school nurse.



Zumbrota-Mazeppa Public Schools Monday, August 28, 2023

Angie Bredehoft called the meeting to order at 7PM.

The pledge of allegiance was recited.

There were no changes to the agenda.

Jason Lohmann motioned to adopt the agenda as presented. Stephanie Miller seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried.

Reports:

Mr. Barnick reported for Mr. Stapletion, MSHS Principal. Mr. Stapleton has visited both historical societies in Zumbrota and Mazeppa and hopes to get students involved. He has been working on the Student handbook and held cell phone discussions with Plainview and Byron about their policies. He is working on a Meat Processing Class and CNA Course.

Mr. Rasmussen thanked the custodians for getting the building looking great. He has been busy working with PLC facilitators, CPI Trainings and other meetings. Mr. Rasmussen explained a change in legislation that recess cannot be taken away from students for missed work. Parents will be given an option to give permission their child can miss recess in order to make up missed work.

Ms. Ahern gave an overview of Targeted Services and ESY and has been busy meeting with PLC Coordinator, Facilitator and Site Team meetings. Building Goals were reviewed and created for the school year. Bridge to Kindergarten was a success again this year. Ms. Ahern also mentioned that all SPED Positions are currently filled.

Mr. Barnick reported on enrollment numbers. He has been working with the Zumbrota Park board to move the State Champion Sign by KwikTrip so it is more visible. All doors will be numbered in the school by the time school starts. Mr. Barnick Thanked the Zumbrota VFW for donating a 10X15 Flag for the Gymnasium wall; he has reached out to the Mazeppa Legion to see if they are interested in donating a flag for the Mazeppa Gym.

Angle Bredehoft called the meeting to order at 7PM.

There were no changes to the agenda.

Jason Lohmann motioned to adopt the agenda as presented. Stephanie Miller seconded the motion. All in favor.

Items for discussion:

1. Policy Review. The following policies were reviewed: 910 Parent Input for Classroom Teachers, 911 Childcare, Alternative School Hours, 714 Fund Balances, 720 Vending Machines and 721 Uniform Grant Guidance. Mr. Barnick mentioned that Mr. Harvey's name is still on #8 of policy 714. He also reviewed the minimum fund balance between 10-15%. Jean Roth

questioned if the school board needs to be involved in Policy 720 Vending Machines. These will be brought back to the September 25th meeting for approval.

2. District Goals. Mr. Barnick reviewed the 22-23 District Goals. He suggest that goal #3 only states "The District will ensure a safe and welcoming learning environment that embraces and welcomes students. This will be brought back to the September 25th meeting for approval.
